- And, most crucial to our mission, continuing our journey of recent years of intentionally incorporating diversity, equity and inclusion into all we do

# MARY IVERS

**O**n Wednesday, February 16, 2022, Dress for Success Cincinnati lost our founder and friend, Mary Ivers. Mary founded DFSC in 1999, and the story was shared in a 2003 article in *The Cincinnati Enquirer*:

*Three years ago, Ms. Ivers was an empty-nester who owned a software company with her husband and had thousands of “mom” volunteer hours under her belt.*

*And she was worried. Not about the last of four children gone to college, but about economic issues in Greater Cincinnati. She learned about many of the issues through Leadership*

*Cincinnati and Leadership Northern Kentucky programs.*

*...*

*Dress for Success chapters in [a few other cities] were “operating successfully and making a difference in people’s lives,” Ms. Ivers says. These programs also were planning Professional Women’s Groups, follow-up programs to provide support for at least the first year of employment.*

*That’s what Ms. Ivers wanted for Greater Cincinnati.*

And that’s what Mary did. Tapping into her connections, Mary secured a second-floor

space downtown at Fourth and Race Streets, compliments of Frisch's. In the first year of operation, about 500 women received clothes. And the scope of DFSC only grew from there.

Mary was an innovator with big dreams. This led her to open, in 2002, 4th Street Boutique, which now does business as Portaluca. Through 4th Street Boutique, DFSC became the first Dress for Success affiliate to open what she described as a "sophisticated thrift store" to sell surplus donated clothing as an additional revenue stream for DFSC. Mary was proud that the business plan for 4th Street Boutique was selected as a finalist in the prestigious Yale School of Management National Business Plan Competition. Twenty years later, Portaluca remains an important extension of the DFSC mission.

It's impossible to quantify the time, talents and treasure she devoted to our beloved organization. Many DFSC supporters were introduced to the organization by Mary herself, and her loss is felt deeply in our community.

Today, we've served nearly 20,000 local women, and Mary's legacy lives on—with each and every woman touched by DFSC. As shared by DFSC client and Portaluca employee, Esther Wing: "The doors my affiliation with Dress for Success has opened for me are countless and have brought me many blessings. I wonder if she really knew how many people she touched and helped."

In addition to her devotion to DFSC, Mary served on the boards of Mount Saint Joseph University, the Cincinnati Women's Club, the Junior League of Cincinnati and Dress for Success Worldwide.

She received an honorary PhD from Mount Saint Joseph University and was recognized as a Great Rivers Girl Scout Council Woman of Distinction, an Athena Award Finalist and Enquirer Woman of the Year (2005).

Mary's legacy is one of accomplishment, philanthropy and a tremendous amount of heart. Mary will forever live on through her good works and relentless efforts to make Greater Cincinnati a better place.

# FACE TO FACE AGAIN

**O**ur programs are our reason for being. It felt SO GOOD to welcome clients into our new home in Norwood and interact face-to-face again, beginning in June 2021. We also used our new setup and the reflective time that was one of the few gifts from the pandemic to refresh and re-energize our programs. Our client participation remains at lower levels than pre-2020, due to ongoing challenges related to the pandemic and the unprecedented employment landscape with a record low unemployment rate. We're shifting to meet women where they are and address their specific barriers. Furthermore, we've been gearing up to meet the increased demand when the employment landscape returns to an employer's market— and unemployment begins to rise.

- 69 volunteers participated in our inclusivity training, which was introduced in June 2021.
- We currently have 84 active referral partner agencies.

# Style HER

*Our signature interview and employment styling services, focused on outfitting women with confidence*

- Clients have been blown away by our beautiful new style studio in Norwood. While in-person styling is preferred, we've retained "style kits"—our no-contact, pandemic solution—to keep as many options open for women to access our services as possible.
- Our Mobile Career Transformation Center went back on the road in July 2021 and offered 13 off-site styling events last year.
- In March 2022, we opened our first satellite style studio at The Care Center, in Loveland, Ohio, so even more women can get past the transportation barrier to get the support they need.

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• **423 styling appointments in 2021**

• **100% of styling clients expressed increased confidence as a result of the experience**

• **98% reported that they would recommend the experience to a friend**

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*Through HigherHER, we work with women both individually and in group settings, to prepare for employment, job search and advancement in their careers.*

- Through our partnership with Cincinnati Works, a dedicated Career Center Specialist is on-site 3 days per week.
- The last program to return in-person is our group, career development program. In Summer 2022, this program will be offered to women at Dayton Correctional Institute and in the CHANGE Court program, to support returning citizens.
- We're leaning into our work with underemployed women—those who are employed, but not at a self-sufficient level. Through a new partnership with EasterSeals and pilot program through Ohio Jobs and Family Services, we've hired a Peer Mentor— a woman with her own lived experience of successfully transitioning off public assistance—who will coach women who are on their own journeys.

**Our clients are employed in a variety of industries, by a variety of employers, including Charter Communications, Cincinnati Children's, Honeywell Aerospace, Nova Home Care, Primerica and Tender Mercies, to name a few.**



*Launched in September 2021, EmpowerHER replaces what was formerly called the Professional Women's Group. At Saturday meetings, women build community and participate in professional development and life skills workshops.*

**Of the 108 members who participated last year:**

**80% reported that they found the network that they met through the program beneficial**

**79% expressed having met a personal, professional or financial milestone in 2021. Examples include promotions, graduating from school, increasing savings, losing weight and completing leadership training or certifications.**





## Stella Returns to DFSC After a Long Journey to Success

**W**eek after week, we see women enter our StyleHER Studio with a drive to achieve their dreams. Each client inspires us with her ambition and desire to take control of her future and gain or regain her self-confidence.

The most inspiring moment for us is when clients return to our StyleHER Studio after gaining employment. We then have the opportunity to pamper these women while styling them with 10 new pieces of clothing to start their new career. With the help of our wonderful volunteers, these women leave our studio clothed head to toe in confidence—ready to achieve their goals.

Stella Pfirman is one of these inspirational women who truly makes the work worthwhile. Stella was first styled for her interview outfit in October 2021. Since then, she has gained employment as a case manager for Talbert House, working to help women like herself get affordable and dependable housing.

She ultimately landed the position at Talbert House thanks to the support of a longtime friend who referred her. “We went through a lot of hardship together and we have both come out on the other side in a much better

place,” Stella said. “I’m very excited to go down this path together with her.”

She and Stella learned about Dress for Success’ services together while at First Step Home in 2014. “I struggled with substance abuse and addiction, and First Step Home is where I finally changed and got it together— that was seven years ago,” Stella said.

Stella feels that her journey can truly exemplify the work she will be doing for Talbert House. “I can confidently speak about the fact that I have a lot of lived experience. I can offer a lot of hope and support and lead by example,” she said. “Being incarcerated and the time period before I got sober, experiencing that was extremely difficult. I know how people can feel and how easily they can go back to the wrong thing.”

Stella attributes part of her success to her new-found confidence through our StyleHER program. “I came here for my interview outfit and I believe it played a huge role in getting me the job,” Stella said.

Stella has applied this confidence to her style as well, putting her best foot forward in any unique style from combat boots to a pair of professional heels. “I like to wear things that are more edgy,” she said. “I want people to say ‘Did you see what she was wearing?’”

After landing her new position, Stella was ecstatic to come back to the studio for her 10 pieces. “I completely forgot that I would be able to come back and pick out more outfits once I got the job,” she said. “Realizing that was like Christmas for me!”

Stella left our studio for the second time with the clothing and confidence to begin the incredible career ahead of her. “It’s just so awesome— and it’s only the beginning,” Stella said. “I’ll be able to get my foot in the door and build my way up, which I’m so excited for.”

Stella looks forward to joining our EmpowerHER program to network with fellow professionals and give back to our organization. “This was amazing. I’m definitely very grateful,” Stella said.



# Portaluca Turns 20!

Started by our founder, Mary Ivers, in September 2002, Portaluca is a vibrant boutique that helps women feel confident, optimistic and beautiful.

The Boutique got an exciting face lift from our move to Norwood. The space is even more vibrant and inspiring than ever before. Open to the public, Portaluca sells women's new and new-ish clothing and accessories at great prices. Delighting the environment and savvy shoppers alike, we give high-quality, donated items a second life.

Portaluca continues to host fall and spring designer showcases— days of fun and fashion. In addition, we've started in-store shopping parties and quarterly warehouse sales to help move inventory. As part of the warehouse sale, Portaluca invites shoppers to fill up a bag for \$20! These sales helped increase revenue while introducing the Boutique to a broader clientele.

Most importantly, all proceeds from Portaluca boutique benefit DFSC. Throughout its 20-year run, Portaluca has given over \$500,000 to our programs and has allowed more women access to clothing that makes them feel ready to take on the world.

Mary's husband, Bill, recounted this story about how the Boutique got started, saying it was typical of how Mary managed to get so many things done:

*Mary came home frustrated, two days in a row. She received clothing donations every day, but while perfectly usable, over half of those clothes were not the business attire DFSC supplied to help clients get jobs. Mary had a plan to open a thrift store to sell these surplus clothing and use the proceeds to support DFSC. But she was running into roadblocks.*

*After a couple of sleepless nights, she jumped on the phone. Mary reached out to her friends at KMK Law. They worked out a way to incorporate the Boutique so DFSC could keep its nonprofit tax status while still being able to use the Boutique funds.*

*Her second call was to the jail to recruit people who were incarcerated for a work release day. Soon all the junk in the shabby basement had been cleaned out, and the walls painted with bright paint Mary secured, free, from a Kentucky paint recycling nonprofit.*

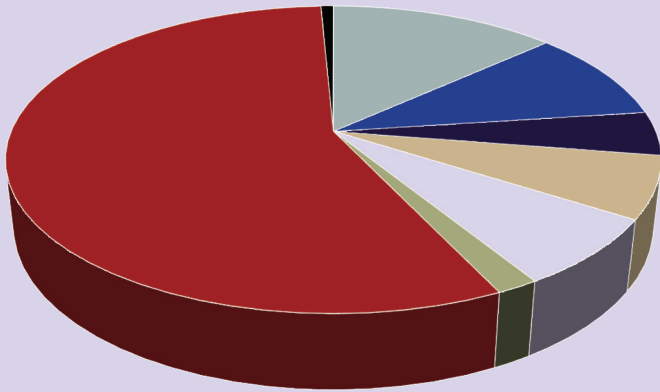
*Mary made another phone call to her friends at Macy's, which was moving into a new location. They had some used display furniture they needed to re-purpose. Soon beautiful glass-covered cabinets were rolling off Macy's trucks down into the basement. They even donated a hundred rolling clothes racks that were invaluable for the Boutique.*

*One week after Mary's sleepless night, the 4th Street Boutique, now Portaluca, opened and has been supporting DFSC's mission ever since. "Mare" always found a way.*

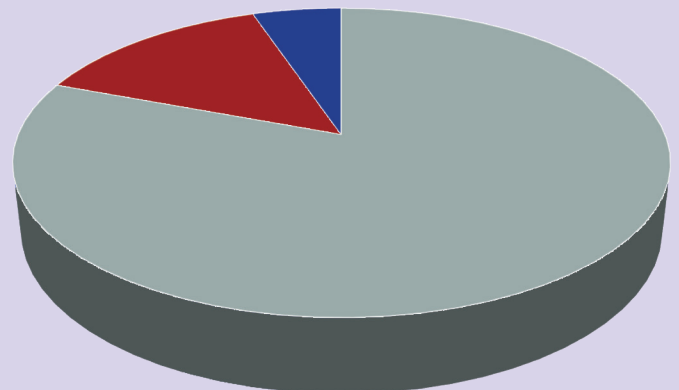
